Chairman's Remarks

Chelgate, the reputation and relationship management consultants to the Northfield developers are planning a public session in the Garsington Village Hall in mid-May to update the village on their plans. They expect to issue further details nearer the time.

The developer's indicative timetable at the moment (although I realise there have been many of these) is to submit the outline principles of the development, a masterplan, to the SODC planning Committee in July. This will be followed by a process of public consultation and workshops at which people may be able to have their say in August and September. Following a decision by SODC on this masterplan there will then be further more detailed planning applications for individual sections of the site. It was indicated at a recent meeting with the developers that that the site could be constructed progressively over a period of twenty years.

The parish council has access to a modest financial reserve called the Community Infrastructure Levy and at the March meeting of the PC it was decided that our priorities for the expenditure of these monies were

1) A footpath at the top of Pettiwell, where there is no pavement

2) A footpath from North Manor to the playground in the Memorial Field and

3) Railings to enhance safety when walking from The Hill into the Village Hall.

A number of people have raised concerns about the absence of parking for users to the Village Hall and specifically in the road without a name between Pettiwell and The Green. In order to address this problem we are trying to arrange for there to be parking restrictions on this road to prohibit people from parking there permanently or all day. We are also going to refer to this road as Plough Lane in future.

St Mary's Garsington PCC Treasurer's Report 2023.

Many thanks to all the villagers that continued to support the Church over 2023. The full accounts for the year will be adopted at the APCM, c10.45am on 28th April after our Breakfast discussion Service – all very welcome.

St Mary's Garsington had a stable year financially, seeing the full-year benefit of the previous year's Generous Giving campaign, services and activities continuing largely as per the normal pattern.

The General Account showed a small surplus of £36, benefitting from a generous legacy of £4,000 which covered the underlying deficit. We once again paid our full Parish Share of £23k and other costs were generally held, apart from Electricity which rose considerably, as expected. Special collections / events mainly funded donations to Asylum Welcome, Christian Aid and Bibles for Garsington School. The General Account balance stands at £20k.

The Fabric Account would have shown a deficit of c£3k had it not been for the very welcome share of the profit from the very successful Fete, which was shared with the School Experience Fund. This and the Christmas Concert donation led to a surplus on the fund of £1,032, but with a commitment to support the church improvement plans from the fund, which stands at £32k. There is now a Fabric Sub-Group with members of the PCC and Fete Committee to oversee the prioritisation of fabric / reordering works from the fund (e.g. repairs to the flooring and porch will cost c£10k+ each).

The majority of regular donors now use the Parish Giving Scheme, which is very good as it significantly helps improve the cash-flow and simplifies the accounting process, for which I personally am very grateful! The Scheme is now also set up to receive one-off donations too, again making the tax reclaim simple and immediate.

Overall, the church does continue to face a financial challenge, despite our income from our many generous regular donors. This is predominantly due to meeting the Parish Share (£25k for 2024) which accounts for 75% of expenditure, but St. Mary's shares this position with many, if not

most, rural parishes in Oxfordshire. The PCC will continue to pay its full share while it can.

The biennial Dorchester-on-Thames Festival is one of Oxfordshire's leading Festivals and is based in and around the stunning location of Dorchester Abbey. The Dorchester Festival takes place this Spring, 3rd – 12th May, with an amazing collection of over 50 events packed into just 10 days at Dorchester Abbey.

Since 2005 the Festival has regularly attracted over 3,000 people each year, from serious followers of the arts to schools, families and children of all ages and has raised significant profile and £250,000 for Dorchester Abbey and local charities.

In 2024 we are partnering with wonderful local charity Restore, who support individuals to live with increased freedom from the constraints of mental ill health, through therapeutic activity, coaching and learning.

Highlights in 2024 include the return of world class classical group The Tallis Scholars, the BBC Elstree Concert Band, the now legendary abseil down the abbey's 100ft tower, cookery workshops by top chefs, comedy, folk and jazz nights, a gift and food fair, and even a duck race. Restore will be adding its own activities focused on mental health and well-being.

Dorchester Festival was started in 2005 following a major restoration of Dorchester Abbey. It was initially a way of encouraging new people into the building and showing the potential of the Abbey as a venue for booking a variety of events.

Over the years it has become a major community event, offering opportunities to members of the community to perform and create and also to experience big professional arts events that would not normally be available on their doorstep in rural South Oxfordshire

It is entirely run by volunteers who take roles organising events, taking tickets or simply pouring tea!

We raise money across the Festival as a whole, and share our profits

equally between Dorchester Abbey and a different local charity every time.



John Howell MP writes...

Issues around the environment are never far away. As I write this month it's The Big Plastic Count. I'm joining lots of people across the country counting the single use plastic that I use this week. It will be interesting to see the data for this year to see how we are doing in moving away from single use plastics. Since the introduction of the Resources and Waste Strategy for England in 2018 significant progress has been made, including a ban on microbeads and restricting the supply of plastic straws, drink stirrers, plasticstemmed cotton buds, plastic plates, trays, bowls, cutlery, balloon sticks and certain types of polystyrene cups and food containers.

Another concern raised with me recently is for our hedgerows which are an important part of our landscape. There are schemes to encourage farmers to maintain and restore existing hedgerows, while also planting more. Defra is also supporting farmers in assessing the condition of hedgerows, and to manage them in a way that will work for wildlife and improve biodiversity. There are also plans in progress for domestic hedgerow regulations which will protect nesting birds in the season.

Another area which I know is of interest to constituents is the growing dependence on new technology and the risk of alienation that this can lead to for some people. We live in an increasingly online world and it is not going to change. This means that digital skills are important - from the basics that people need to make the most of online connectivity, to the skills needed in every job, to the high-level skills for the growing number of specialist jobs in the economy. The Government is committed to helping those who need support to acquire basic digital skills and is also working to remove barriers. This is all part of its broader strategy to reduce digital exclusion and very welcome.

Update on St Mary's Church seating

In recent months, a small group of villagers have been meeting with members of the PCC to explore options to improve the interior and exterior of St Mary's Church. We have been exploring possible improvements to the seating, to increase the flexibility of the very impressive space we have within St Mary's.

A few years ago, some damaged and unused pews were removed, some of which were purchased by villagers. We have been considering whether we could further reduce the number of pews. Many rural churches in Oxfordshire and beyond have already replaced pews with chairs. For St Mary's, it could contribute to encouraging more people to come into the building, and providing potential additional sources of income.

After the highly successful popular music event in Church in December, we reconfigured the layout of some pews and chairs. The shortest pews have been moved to the middle section of the church, either side of the central aisle, with some chairs alongside. The longer pews, have been moved to the side and back of the Church. So far, we have received a lot of positive feedback. We would therefore like to reduce the number of pews. One option could be to remove all the longer pews, leaving just the twelve shorter ones in the central section, as currently laid out.

In the short term, we hope to upgrade the current brown chairs at very low or no cost, before eventually replacing these with stackable wooden chairs, more in fitting with an older church. This final step would require fund-raising, possibly including the option of villagers sponsoring a chair and having a small plaque with their name or other commemoration placed on it. The wooden chairs would be aesthetically pleasing, and comfortable, and would complement and enhance the internal appearance of the Church. We are eager to ensure that the capacity is not significantly reduced by the replacement of some pews with more flexible seating.

We hope to complete repairs to the porch and floor this summer, which would then enable us to plan and implement improvements to seating. This would require formal applications and permissions. Please do have a look inside the church, and let us know your thoughts on seating and other possible improvements to the church interior. The Owl and the Pussycat. AI GENERATED ART A historical and evolution overview. A talk to the Garsington Society

On a wet February evening, a sizable crowd gathered in the village hall for the event. Before the talk started, the audience witnessed a brief demonstration utilising a small robotic vacuum cleaner with coloured pens attached. The robot once moving drew its random and constrained movements on the paper it was placed on. The audience were then taken through the brief and short history of AI Art, illuminated with numerous creations sourced from specialist AI Art interest groups.

Creations are generated on various AI Art application platforms, predominantly by 'text to image'. This is where a list of descriptive terms are used to describe the creation envisaged. They are fed into an algorithmic model, and within seconds a creation is produced. This can be undertaken on either a laptop, tablet or even a smart phone.

The audience were then invited to suggest prompts to create their own creation live on screen. These followed the simple maxim of SUBJECT, SUBSUBJECT, ARTISTIC STYLE, MEDIUM, DESCRIPTIVE TERMS.

In order, the audience called out the following - seascape, boat, storm, cubism, mosaic, deep dark colours, uplifting, cat and owl in a boat.

The algorithmic model, Stable Diffusion SDXL 1.0 was selected and a batch of four Owl and the Pussycat images appeared on the screen. The best of that batch was then evolved further culminating in the creation that now adorns the cover of this newsletter. The evening culminated in extensive questioning by the audience. 
